Thom Collegiate - Cap & Gown Ceremony 2025

The Cap & Gown Ceremony is the formal academic part of graduation which recognizes and celebrates the students of Thom Collegiate

Date:	Tuesday, June 24, 2025		
Location:	Conexus Arts Centre Lakeshore Drive, Regina, SK		
Time:	Program begins promptly at 9:00 a.m. and will last approximately one hour and 45 minutes. Doors open for guests at 8:15 a.m.		
Eligibility:	Only those students who achieve the graduation requirements as prescribed by the Ministry of Education will be permitted to walk across the stage to receive their diplomas and have their names printed in the program.		
Cost:	\$60.00 per student – This fee pays for the facility rental, costs associated with the ceremony, the purchase of graduation caps and gowns, which are theirs to keep.		
Ceremony:	On Graduation Day at Conexus Arts Centre, Grade 12 students will meet downstairs in the Schumiatcher Room at 8:15 a.m.		
	At this ceremony, students will receive their diplomas and any academic awards that they have earned during the course of the year. Students will be on stage long enough for parents to photograph the proud moment. The front row will be reserved for this purpose. Graduates will cross the stage only once, except for Bronze, Silver, and Gold Staff medal recipients and the Governor General Bronze Medal recipient.		
Dress Code:	Graduation is a formal event.		
Pictures:	When the ceremony is complete, grads will have 30 minutes to take photographs with fami and friends.		

Honour Roll Criteria

Awarded to students who have achieved an average of 79.5% or higher in a minimum of 6 courses taken within that school year with Regina Public Schools.

- Classes will be included from both the home school and CRP
- All required and elective courses are included
- Drivers' Education courses are not included
- Regular, modified, or vocational classes can be used to determine honour roll eligibility.
- Sask DLC classes are not included in Honour Roll calculations.

Medalist Criteria

- The Gold, Silver, and Bronze medalists for grade 12 will be determined by calculating the average of the following classes at Regina Public Schools:
 - ELA A30
 - ELA B30
 - Highest 30 level social science credit (Social 30/History 30 /Indigenous Studies 30)
 - Highest 3 electives

Governor General medal

• Upon graduation from high school, the Governor General medal is awarded to the student who achieves the highest average from **all** grade 11 and 12 courses listed on student's official transcript as issued by the Ministry of Education.
